Today is the 34th year of the Premier Trophy Awards, and this year we have welcomed three new judges onto the judging panel. The privilege of looking at all the varied and outstanding work was worth all the travelling around the country from Aberdeen in the north to Plymouth in the south.

Attending the awards ceremony in Plaisterers' Hall in the City of London and seeing the awards being presented is gratifying after all the hard work put in by the companies, the Painting and Decorating Association and fellow judges.

The 2023 awards received eighty-three entries, covering all aspects of the painting and decorating industry. These were then assessed and scrutinised by the judges, who were able to select forty-eight jobs to visit. The nine judges, John Noble, Frank Miller, Ray Williams, Colin Barnes, Colin Baker, Frank Scott, Trevor King, David Bristow and myself conducted the selection, visiting and final analysis. We are all independent of the Painting and Decorating Association and are full members of the Institute of Clerk of Works and Construction Inspectorate.

The judges travelled throughout England, Wales, and Scotland to an exacting timetable; despite minor upsets with last-minute cancellations, we completed all our scheduled visits. The quality of work produced was very high considering the difficulties that had to be overcome regarding access, time limits, research on specialist paint finishes, health and safety and environmental requirements.

Meeting the contractors on-site with the clients enhanced the judges' awareness of the different aspects of the projects that had to be overcome to achieve a successful outcome and really assisted with the judging.

Interesting visits this year included blocks of flats, bridges, private houses, retirement living, student accommodation, car parks, universities, churches, schools, hotels, theatres, memorials, town halls, steelworks, and retirement properties are just a selection. The diversity of the projects visited by the judges ranged from the redecoration of one or two rooms to complex high-value jobs.

We appreciated the welcome from the

contractors and the courtesy, friendliness, warm welcome and readiness to answer our questions when visiting sites, their continued support for the awards is enormously helpful, without which it would not be the success it is. We also thank the contractors who provided onward transport when we used trains to get to our visits.

Sponsorship provided for the awards shows the degree of status they are held in by all those who give their support. Without their generosity, it would be so much more difficult. Finally, a thank you to the paint manufacturers and suppliers for encouraging the contractors to enter their work.

A big thank you also goes to all the staff at the PDA, especially Yvonne, for organising our hotels and liaising with the contractors, without whose assistance and guidance the awards would not be the success it is.

Thank you to all who participated in this year's Premier Trophy Awards. If you have not been a winner, make sure you are ready with a project for 2024 which we will look forward to visiting.

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PDA Apprentice of the Year 2023

This year's Apprentice of the Year competition brings new developments in response to an ever-increasing demand for participant places. Apprentice and Trainee applications have been greater, by far, this year than in previous years. In total, 65 Apprentice-Trainees attended the four heats. We found that the usual pattern of three heats would be guickly oversubscribed, so a fourth heat was a clear requirement. A Scottish event was added to the traditional North, Midlands, and Southern heats. This was the first time the competition offered a heat in Scotland.

A further development saw the system of identifying our winners and runners-up change. As always, the successful competitors from each heat were identified by robust judging and assessment criteria. However, these successful competitors, this year, then went

forward to the next competition level, a grand finale, where they completed a further decorative paint scheme. It was at this stage that the runner-up and the winner would be identified for each of the two categories.

All competitors participating in the regional heats completed the same decorative task depending on their Junior or Senior skill level category. Then, a further final task was prepared and presented to the participants, challenging their skill ability for a second time.

All the tasks focused on requiring participants to demonstrate their ability to interpret drawings, measure accurately and set out the specified assignment on the surface of their work panel. Reading, interpreting a specification correctly and applying paint to achieve a professional finish were also critical factors that had to be demonstrated by the competitors. In addition, an awareness of safe working practices and an ability to work in a clean and tidy manner was also assessed by the judging panel.

THE REGIONAL HEATS

HEAT 1. ACCRINGTON & ROSSENDALE COLLEGE

Participant Numbers: 16

Seniors: Male 3 Female 4 > Juniors: Male 6 Female 3

This college provided well-proportioned workstations. All had space to achieve their potential and demonstrate their craft skills. Phil Burgess oversaw resources and management planning, while technician Megan Talbot ensured that the competitors' practical resources were readily available as required. Notably, Megan, a PDA competitor in 2018 and 2019, took 2nd and 3rd place in the Competition during those years. Megan is now the P&D workshop technician at the College and is developing her contribution to P&D by taking on the additional duty of teaching. Megan is also currently



working towards a teaching degree. This a fine example of how the P&D craft can be a springboard to improving vocational life chances yet retaining the lure of the craft.

HEAT 2. GLASGOW COLLEGE

Participant Numbers: 20

Seniors: Male 2 Female 1 > Juniors: Male 13 Female 4

A modern college with a purpose-built construction workshop to which the P&D department worthily contributes. The workshop facility here was bright and spacious, with the workstations set out in an innovative side-by-side but excellent systematic manner. Each competitor competently managed the task and used the resource to achieve and complete the set decorative scheme adequately. Management of the day was ably overseen by Michael McEwan, who demonstrated his ability to ensure competitor achievement was possible. This was the first time the Apprentice Trainee Award Competition was held in Scotland. There seems to be no reason why we will not return in 2024.

HEAT 3. SOUTH & CITY COLLEGE BIRMINGHAM Participant Numbers: 13

Seniors: Male 1 Female 2 > Juniors: Male 5 Female 5

A modern and welcoming college located at Longbridge on the original British Leyland motor works site. Mark Morris and his team ensured the competition day progressed in a professional manner. The College workshop provided excellent light and space, allowing work to progress efficiently. Most of the competitors in this Midlands heat were from the wider Midlands region. However, one competitor made the journey by air from Belfast to participate. Such is the significant nature of this competition and the wish to enthusiastically demonstrate their craft skills that individuals will do all they can to participate, despite the demanding journey times.











HEAT 4. NORTH KENT COLLEGE

Participant Numbers: 16

Seniors: Male 7 Female 1 > Juniors: Male 4 Female 4

This was the most southern college in the competition. The Southern Region catchment area attracted participants from the London area, Kent and further afield. Karen Wyatt was tasked with accommodating the Competitors in a compactsized workshop but more than adequately met all necessary requirements. Workspace allowed competitors to thrive and display their craft skills, and with the help of technician Jo, resources were on hand to ensure all practical requests received positive responses.

THE FINAL DONCASTER COLLEGE

Participant Numbers: 8

Seniors: Male 0 Female 4 > Juniors: Male 2 Female 2

From each of the four heats, a winner and runner-up for both Senior and Junior categories were identified. These successful competitors were invited to Doncaster College to repeat their skill competencies in this grand final heat against their peer group. Doncaster College provided an exclusive competition workshop facility that gave the finalists all the opportunities they needed to display their skills. Glen Galbraith managed his workshop during this final with all the necessary rigour expected in a challenge of this nature. His effort gave the competitors all the opportunities they needed to excel at their workstations.

Thanks to our sponsors, your contribution is very welcome and ensures that the competition thrives yearly. Thank you also to Tom Little for his work in developing the various task schemes.


